Then the speaker asked this question, and this is what really stuck with me: how do you go from covering your face out of fear to being so close to God that you are "a friend"?

It is a great question that really resonates in my heart. There are many times I feel the "separation" from God that Moses displayed when he covered his face in fear. There are many times I have wondered how I could possibly move from that position of separation and fear and, somehow, get closer to God – maybe close enough to actually be considered a face-to-face "friend" of God. Maybe that is the answer to the question. Maybe Moses didn't do anything to move from being separated from God to becoming a friend of God. Maybe God is the one who did it and that Moses merely allowed it to happen.

If that is the answer for Moses, then maybe it is the same answer for us as well. God wants to be in a close relationship with us. God has invited us. God has given His Spirit to live in our lives and to enable us to be transformed. Maybe all we need to do is let Him. I had the privilege of attending the American Baptist annual region meeting in Effingham this past week. I don't always enjoy these kinds of meetings, but I really did enjoy it this time and I am encouraged with what is happening in the American Baptist world.

One of the speakers said something that really impacted me. He referenced two different passages from Exodus: Exodus 3:6 where God first appeared to Moses and Moses was so afraid that he covered his face; and Exodus 33:11 where it said that God used to speak to Moses face-to-face as one speaks to a friend. Then the speaker asked this question, and this is what really stuck with me: how do you go from covering your face out of fear to being so close to God that you are "a friend"?

It is a great question that really resonates in my heart. There are many times I feel the "separation" from God that Moses displayed when he covered his face in fear. There are many times I have wondered how I could possibly move from that position of separation and fear and, somehow, get closer to God – maybe close enough to actually be considered a face-to-face "friend" of God. The question hangs in my mind. How can I go make that transition?

The speaker didn't answer the question, he just left it hanging there for us to consider. I am still considering it. The problem is that the Bible doesn't tell us the answer. We see that God initiated the process by calling Moses to a task (leading the Israelites) and that as Moses responded, God began doing incredible things in Moses' life and revealed more and more of himself to Moses. But we don't see that Moses did anything to make it happen. God is the one who initiated the process and God is the one who transformed Moses from being a fearful shepherd who covered his face and made him to be a mighty spiritual leader who was a friend of God. Maybe that is the answer to the question. Maybe Moses didn't do anything to move from being separated from God to becoming a friend of God. Maybe God is the one who did it and that Moses merely allowed it to happen.

If that is the answer for Moses, then maybe it is the same answer for us as well. God wants to be in a close relationship with us. God has invited us. God has given His Spirit to live in our lives and to enable us to be transformed. Maybe all we need to do is let Him. Maybe all we need do is respond favorably to God's invitation and enter into the relationship to which He is calling us.

I am a work in progress. I'm not there yet, but I look forward to the rest of the journey. I pray that you will allow God's Spirit to take you on that journey as well. May He transform you so that you truly do become His "friend" as He reveals himself more fully to you in the days and weeks to come.
