

**Discussion / Reflection Guide -- “Set Free!”**  
**Week of March 11, 2018**

**Read: Exodus 12:21-30; 1 Peter 1:18-21**

- The teachings of the New Testament do require that we sacrifice animals in order to please God or to protect us from God’s anger like was true in the Old Testament (OT).
- Why did God use the blood on the door as a “sign” that the inhabitants of the house were God’s people? Why didn’t he use some other less offensive sign?
- God considers sin to be totally unacceptable; completely abhorrent. Sin and rebellion is so offensive to God that he has declared the penalty for sin to be death. Romans 6:23.
- John the Baptist called Jesus the “lamb of God” in John 1:29. In what way is Jesus like the Passover Lamb of Exodus 12? How is the image of spreading blood over the outside door of a house similar to what God wants us to do in the New Testament? See 1 Peter 1:18-21.
- Who made the sacrifice in Exodus 12 in order to secure “salvation?” Who made the sacrifice in 1 Peter 1:18-21 in order to secure “salvation?” Why is that significant?
- Those who did not have the blood of the lamb in Exodus 12 suffered God’s wrath. Is the same true of those who do not place their faith in Jesus? 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9.
