

**Discussion Guide -- “Get Your Feet Wet”**  
**Week of May 6, 2018**

**Read Joshua 1:5-9; 3:8-17; Hebrews 13:5-6**

- What did God tell Joshua to do? How easy would this have been? Moses was the only leader the Israelites had known for 40 years. If you were Joshua, what would be running through your head if God called you to step into Moses’ shoes and take over?
- God gave Joshua some promises in Joshua 1:5-9. Would those promises be comforting? Which part of God’s statements to Joshua stands out to you? Why?
- Has God ever put a similar “assignment” before you where you felt God wanted you to do something which might have been out of your comfort zone? How did you respond? What happened? How did it work out?
- God gave a warning in Joshua 1:7. God was making His assistance contingent upon Joshua being faithful. Do you think God still requires us to be faithful before he will help us?
- God told Joshua He was going to help him, but didn’t seem to give a lot of details. The priests were to go stand in the water (Joshua 3:8), but God didn’t say what would happen next. Pastor Dan stated that God often asks us to “get our feet wet” before God lends His aid and helps us. Has God ever asked you to get your feet wet? Why does God do this? What lessons have you learned from having to “get your feet wet?”
- God promises to be there to help us (Hebrews 13:5-6) if we remain faithful and trust Him. What does this promise mean to you? Is it encouraging?
