

## **Discussion Guide For the Week of Oct. 14, 2018**

Read 2 Chronicles 15:1-7 – pew Bible pg. 695

2 Chronicles 16:9; Acts 17:27-28a

- In 2 Chronicles 15:2 God told King Asa He would stay with him as long as he stayed with Him; if he seeks Him he will find Him; but if he abandons God, God will abandon him. God was trying to encourage the King to remain faithful to God – and promised blessings in return.
- Do you believe these statements also apply to us or were they just intended for Asa? Assuming these statements apply to us in some way, do you find any of them to be comforting? Are they troubling? Why are they comforting / troubling to you?
- Have you ever gone through a ‘season’ when you “abandoned” God? If you are discussing this with a group, give a brief explanation of that time in your life. Did you feel God had “abandoned” you too? What happened to make you turn back and “seek” the Lord?
- The prophet suggested that God may have brought trouble to the nation as a way of bringing them back to Him (2 Chron. 15:5-6). Do you believe God ever brought trouble to you in order to get your attention and bring you back to Him? Again, discuss this with the group.
- After discussing the fact that God created people and nations, what does the Bible say God’s purpose was in Acts 17:27, 30?
